## EULOGY

Heather Elizabeth McDonald was born in Hamilton on 7th April 1928 youngest daughter of Andrew & Bessie McDonald and sister to Mary and Jean. The 3 girls had a wonderful childhood on the family farm, where Heather gained her love for fishing and an outdoor life. Farm life was hard during her childhood, her father was a keen hunter and fisherman and would leave the running of the farm and milking the cows to the girls, Heather said that her father would disappear whenever there was work to be done, but they were always well fed and clothed.

During the war when she was around 15 years old, she was employed as a boundary rider by some of the local farming families whose men had gone to war, she enjoyed the freedom of riding around checking fences and livestock.

Heather married Jack Willis on the 3rd of September 1947 in Merino. This was the beginning of a long happy marriage, where they welcomed 7 girls and 1 boy into their life. She continued a life of hard work on their 1st World War Soldier Settlers farm on Sheep Wash Rd in Paschendale, A move to Hamilton in 1958 started a new chapter, where ultimately Heather and Jack farmed for Mr Bob Strachan. This continued for 35 years. Regardless of how busy life was, Heather would support her children with their own individual love of sport or activities.

Semi-retirement saw them purchase their own farm at Croxton East breeding Charolais cattle with help from their only son Ricky. Finally, they could relax and spend time travelling and sharing moments with family and friends. Including trips on the Murray River, a loved destination.

Heather moved to an independent living unit at Eventide in 2014, her family and friends remained important to her. She lived a full, healthy and independent life for 97 + years, she had a fall at home in mid-December, followed by a short stay in hospital. Unfortunately, her health rapidly declined, and she was transferred to palliative care; this was an opportunity for all her family to visit and spend the last precious days with her. She passed away peacefully on Sunday 28th while listening to the bagpipes with one of her daughters beside her.
