

REMEMBERING LAURIE

Lawrence Zschech was born on the 24th of April 1934, in Horsham, Victoria, only son of Herbert Zschech and Anna Elizabeth Tonissen. He spent his childhood on his parents' farm at Jung North which is north-east of Horsham. On the 3rd of June 1934 Lawrence was baptised in Zion Lutheran Church, Kewell, Victoria. In 1937 the family moved from the farm at Jung due to his father no longer able to work the wheat farm and purchased a grazing property "Parkside" on Depot Lane (now Beveridges Rd), Hamilton, initially living in Tarrington until the home at Parkside was built.

Lawrence attended the Lutheran School in Tarrington, until the family moved to Parkside around 1940. In 1943 his sister Cheryl was born. Lawrence attended Hamilton Gray Street School, then Hamilton High School and later Hamilton Technical School. While attending High School he had a regular paper delivery finishing his run in Mt Baimbridge Rd where friends of the family gave him breakfast before heading to school. On the 19th of December 1948 Lawrence was confirmed in the Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd Hamilton by Pastor Rosenblatt.

Lawrence commenced a motor mechanics apprenticeship with R.I. King Motors and completed four years before having to resign to help work the farm. Lawrence enjoyed his time working there. In his youth Lawrence rode a motor bike to work.

Lawrence and Joan Ivy Salzke were married on the 10th of September 1959 at St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Gerogery West, NSW. The marriage was blessed with four children; Heather, Carol, Ian and Neal. They took on 200 acres at Parkside. Animals were a passion, in particular dogs. He had Pomeranians as a child and then sheep dogs.

He did his three months National Service Training in the 1950's, (winning the Queen's Medal). He was in the R.A.E.M.E. Core. Winning the Puckapunyal Rifle Shooting Cup.

Lawrence was a member of the Hamilton rifle team that won a State Championship. For several years, he was a member of the club committee. He also enjoyed pistol shooting.

Lawrence participated in the Hamilton Luther League activities, helped with the earthworks for the Hamilton Outdoor Swimming Pool and worked on the foundation work for the current Lutheran Church.

His lifelong dream was to get his pilot's license, and he took up learning to fly light aircraft in the 1980's. He loved giving family and friends a free flight. In the 1980's Carol was in hospital in Melbourne after a knee reconstruction. Lawrence and a fellow aero club member flew to Melbourne to visit, although if you ask Carol, it was not about her, it was more about flying. Ian would say that he was better at flying than driving. As Ian tells it once he fell asleep while droving sheep and drove through a fence.

One of his hobbies for many years was Amateur Radio, his call sign was VK3ALZ. He was a member of the Hamilton Radio Club and was forever building towers, aerials and actual radios, spending many hours talking to people within Australia and overseas. When computers became a thing, he was an early adopter. Neal used to have to watch him on it and if he was lucky got to use the keyboard.

Lawrence was also a member of the CFA, and also helped Joan with the euchre nights at Community House.

Lawrence was a Church Elder for approximately 20 years. He was member of a Home Group and led their Bible Study for many years. Lawrence and Ron Hartwich spent many hours working on the amplification system in the church, and he also recorded the services on an old reel to reel tape recorder.

He was on the first Parents and Friends committee for Good Shepherd College.

In 1994 Joan and Lawrence went overseas for around seven weeks travelling around Europe, then spent a week with Allan's relatives and a further week around England with June and Brian, Allan's sister and brother-in-law.

In the year 2000 Ian took over the farm and in theory Lawrence retired. Mum and Dad went to the Sydney Olympics and Heather looked after them, taking them around to events.

In 2001 Lawrence was diagnosed with a thyroid condition which required an operation, radioactive treatment and lifelong medication.

The USA called in 2002, and they travelled to Orlando, Florida part of the trip was a weekend cruise to the Bahamas, and they then stopped off in Hawaii including a visit to the Kilauea volcano on the way home. Mum said his suitcase was always that heavy because it was full of books. Dad spent hours in libraries and reading. There was always a science book close by.

The time came in 2023 for him to hand in his license and stay off the roads behind the wheel. However, he was very good at giving other people instructions.

In November 2023 Lawrence had a replacement valve put into one of his arteries.

In August 2024 Lawrence was placed into permanent care in the Grange Hamilton as he could no longer cope at home. On the 8th of November 2025 he passed away peacefully in his sleep at the Grange. Lawrence is survived by his wife, Joan, his four children, seven grandchildren and one great grandson.
